



Using natural and photographic elements Christine Atkinson explores the seductive and fragile quality found in the environment. She creates sculpture that is lightly infused with photographic materials then photographs the finished product giving a dual perspective. Her tools vary, but a constant fascination with portraiture remains. This creates a habitat where the understanding of a plant or rock becomes personal. Her activism is apparent in Remnant which is epoxy treated debris from a wildfire. The obvious connotation is of relic found in a museum that is no more. In of Paradise (I and II) leaves, film, epoxy and cinema gel fuse together to project a more complete narrative, one that speaks to man's influence over the natural world.
